Q4: Describe the finding. What the underlying cause? What risks are the patient is predisposed in future? Spider fingers. Marfan syndrome. Aortic aneurysm, pneumthrax.



Q5: What is this test is demonstrating in a patient with anaemia? Osmotic fragility test. Spherocytosis.
